

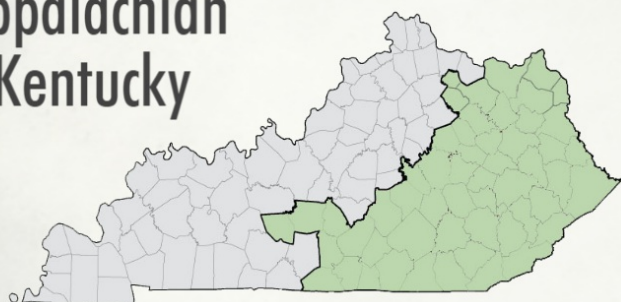


# Kentucky Appalachian Higher Education (KY AHED) 2011-2016

## Appalachian Kentucky



KY AHED funds the implementation of curricular and place-based strategies to improve access to postsecondary education for high school students throughout the Appalachian region of Kentucky. The program focuses on best practices promoting postsecondary education attainment as identified in significant studies of attendance rates, high school graduation rates, and Bachelor degrees awarded in the region. To address the barriers to postsecondary education enrollment, KY AHED provides funding to public high schools on a competitive basis to develop and implement proven strategies for promoting postsecondary education access. The high schools' specific target: students who do not consider postsecondary education an option.
